I, Disha Arora, was robbed and molested by two boys on the 1st of May, 2014 near Vishwas Nagar Puliya, Gali no. 17. They first grabbed me from behind, pushed me to the floor, dragged me, molested me, beat me and then finally snatched all my belongings.

This incident was something that I never expected myself to experience ever in my life. It had not only left me in a traumatic state but also left me with way too many questions which I feel could never be answered. It made me question my strength, my ability to fight for myself and my belief to feel free whenever wherever.

Fortunately, the Delhi Police did something that again, I did not expect at all. In fact, I'm actually quite impressed. The two criminals have been caught along with the entire gang of criminals, which is apparently called the 'Cutter Gang' (they use cutters to rob people and some of them in the gang are charged of murder too). And not just that, all my belongings including even the smallest things inside my bag and my phone have been found.

I really want to thank Joint CP Mr. Sanjay Beniwal for personally putting in efforts to solve my case. Also, Joint CP, Crime, Mr. Ravinder Yadav for prioritizing my case. I am really grateful to DCP, East District, Mr. Ajay Kumar and Additional DCP, Mr. Hareesh HP for setting up a special team headed by Inspector Rakesh Dixit who went all out to catch those guys. And of course, ACP Mr. Jai Krishna Gautam and SHO Mr Harish for being at it since the very beginning. I'm seriously quite happy that they actually did catch the criminals. I was not expecting this at all and was definitely not expecting to get my bag back with all my belongings in it, but I actually did.

This incident is not something that I can forget easily and it will always stay with me somewhere and I really wish it wouldn't have happened only in the first place, but, it has definitely made me come out stronger and made me aware of the fact that if I can't stop such things from happening, I can at least do my best to fight them instead of just accepting it and letting it go. Having said that, obviously my questions regarding my strength and my safety cannot still be answered, but I am definitely satisfied about the fact that at least now I know that if such an incident happens again, the Delhi Police has the potential to solve it and

to get it to a Conclusion. Those people deserve to be punished and hopefully, the Court will make sure they do so rightfully.

I do not know if them having being caught and punished is going to make a difference as a whole or not or if its actually going to change anything, but it has definitely brought in some Hope that maybe, IT WILL. I am grateful to all the Delhi Police Officers who were sincerely involved in my case, for giving me that Hope.
